

Prayer Fuels Mission and Mission Fuels Prayer: Prayer is not the end goal—it's the fuel that drives us into the harvest. Likewise, engagement with the lost drives us back into deeper prayer and dependence on God.

- Live with Matthew 9 and Matthew 10 Together: We don't get to choose between being prayer people or mission people; Jesus called us to pray for laborers and become the laborers. Prayer and disciple-making are inseparably linked.
- Sheep Are Fed in the Pasture and Nurtured in the Pen: True
 nourishment happens both by engaging the lost (pasture) and
 withdrawing into the secret place (pen). A healthy disciple lives
 fully in both spaces.
- Foster a Lifestyle of Prayer and Obedience: Mobilizing prayer means cultivating communities that listen to God's voice and respond in simple, immediate obedience.
- Multiply Disciple-Makers, Not Just Prayer Gatherings: Teach believers that prayer naturally leads to disciple-making, and disciple-making keeps prayer fervent, personal, and urgent.
- Anchor Everything in Christ and His Kingdom: Keep Jesus at the center, aligning prayer and mission around His heart, His Word, and His command to go and make disciples of all nations.
- Equip Ordinary Believers to Carry Both Prayer and Mission: Every believer is called to both the secret place and the harvest field.
 Empower them to live in both realms, not just leadership teams or special groups.

learnings

- Focus on Spirit-Led Simplicity: Gatherings should remain simple and Spirit-directed, making room for people to hear God clearly and be sent out.
- Cultivate a Culture of Both Harvest and Consecration: Teach
 that harvesting (reaching the lost) and consecration (deepening
 holiness and prayer) must grow side-by-side, not separately.
- See Prayer Rooms as Sending Rooms: Prayer spaces are not retreats from mission but launching pads where laborers are envisioned, equipped, and commissioned.
- **Practice Obedience-Based Discipleship:** Prayer and Bible engagement should always move toward practical steps of obedience, multiplying both faith and transformation.
- Pursue Citywide Unity with a Missional Heart: True unity comes when the Church prays and acts together, seeking not just revival inside the church but transformation across the city.
- Prepare Through Repentance and Fasting: Deep, Spirit-led movements of prayer and mission are birthed through humility, repentance, and dependence on God.
- Expect and Celebrate Fruitfulness: Testimonies of healing, salvation, answered prayers, and new disciples build faith that God truly moves when prayer and mission are joined.
- Stay Rooted in Hope: Even when results are slow or hidden, trust that prayer-saturated mission work is sowing seeds that God is faithful to bring to harvest in His time.

For this reason, I strongly opposed using any organization's name in the title of our prayer canopy, which led to our decision to call it the Clark County Prayer Canopy. - Provide a prayer guide to keep the prayer on target.
- Have a start and end time to maintain order and integrity.
- Select the people to pray to keep the prayer time on time and on target.
- Ensure that 3/4 of the time together is praying.
- Send out multiple notices of the prayer time with the date, time, location and link if zoom.
- As the leader, model enthusiasm for prayer.
- From time to time call out the names of the prayer warriors with appreciation.
- Be relational and authentic with participants. Prayer is ministry and relational, not transactional.
- Unity is not sameness. Unity is each unique part joining in concert to create a beautiful symphonic sound of all parts. Celebrate and encourage each part to develop to its fullest for a most excellent sound when all together.

Learned through ministry in the Columbus region and beyond

- Stay at His feet Everything begins with intimacy. Don't start in
 the Spirit and then get too busy to continue. The power to lead,
 mobilize, and sustain prayer flows from consistent time with Jesus.
 Remaining at His feet keeps the fire burning and ensures we move
 from overflow, not exhaustion.
- Collaboration is powerful Unity among churches, ministries, and leaders breaks territorial barriers, expands kingdom impact, and prevents burnout. We're stronger together.
- **Prayer must be Spirit-led and Word-rooted** Aligning prayer with Scripture and the leading of the Holy Spirit brings precision, power, and fruit.
- Involve every generation Invite young people, elders, and everyone in between to pray. There is power in multi-generational intercession. Bring the next generation with us.
- Celebrate wins and testimonies Sharing answered prayers and breakthrough stories stirs faith and reminds people that prayer works.
- Consistency builds momentum Regular rhythms like weekly noonday prayer create spiritual discipline and sustain engagement over time. ->

learnings

- Keep learning from those who've gone before Never stop learning. Seek wisdom from spiritual fathers and mothers who have lived a life of prayer. Their experiences and best practices are treasures for the journey ahead.
- Train and equip others Reproducing leaders and empowering others to lead and teach prayer builds sustainability and multiplies impact.
- Cover with love and humility A culture of love and humility protects unity and creates a safe space for growth and honest prayer.
- Discern spiritual climate shifts Stay sensitive to what God is doing in your region and respond accordingly in prayer focus and mobilization.
- It's not about your brand or logo Give all glory to God.
 Remember, the goal is to magnify Him, not to build personal fame or recognition. Our efforts in prayer are always about lifting His name, not our own.

To effectively mobilize prayer in our ministry and throughout the city, we have embraced several key principles and best practices.

- First, we promote openness and inclusivity to the various Christian denominations in our city to ensure that all voices are heard and welcomed in our prayer initiatives. We also encourage personal prayer lives, empowering individuals to deepen their connection with God alongside our corporate efforts. Celebrating answers to prayer has become a vital part of our community, as sharing testimonies inspires and motivates others to engage in prayer.
- We utilize diverse prayer formats to cater to different preferences and encourage participation, ensuring that everyone can find a way to connect through prayer. Regularly scheduled and consistent prayer meetings help to build accountability and foster community, creating a rhythm of prayer that participants can rely on. We focus on the intentionality of those gathering vs size or count of those gathering.
- To gain broader support, we actively engage senior ministry leaders, rallying their endorsement and involvement to lend credibility and strength to our efforts. Additionally, we have a prayer task force comprised of dedicated volunteers who take on leadership roles within the initiative, helping to coordinate events and outreach efforts. ->

learnings

 These combined strategies have galvanized our city to pray and continue to grow in our collective prayer journey. We saw great decline after COVID, but stayed relevant through online prayer and we have observed growing participation in the Summit County National Day of Prayer effort, which Love Akron has been overseeing for the past three years.

- Listening over asking. This goes for prayer as well as for all other relational communication. (**Pray to hear**)
- Worship looks different, but the fruits of the Spirit are the same.
 (Pray to see)
- Extrovert or introvert—we all need community. (**Pray for others**)
- Small practices/disciplines go a long way in building a framework for future spiritual formation. (**Pray consistently**)
- History tells us much. We ought to listen. (Pray in liturgy)
- Ministry on an island (by yourself) is dangerous. (Pray in community)

I feel like a beginner in prayer and I know the Prayer Canopy was raised by Jesus, it happened so fast! We have 60 ministries and over 1000 intercessors. Each ministry does their best to mobilize 24 hours of prayer on their "day to pray".

However, we are learning that it takes constant attention to refresh and keep leaders and intercessors engaged. We pray the Lord's prayer, we pray over the mountains of culture, and periodically we challenge our intercessors to self-examination and recentering on an intimate conversation with

- Creating space for all emotions to show up in prayer and reinforcing the truth that God welcomes all of us in our prayers.
- Linking meditation of Scripture to prayer to stimulate our minds and hearts.

Praying Pastorally

- Specifically honoring lament as prayer and worship while not rushing the process of grief.
- Sitting in grief prayerfully and silently when necessary.
- Offering life giving prayers which hold space for the autonomy and freedom of those being prayed for.
- Honoring people's prayer history and understanding their perspectives and pain.
- Creating physical space for people to engage in prayer as they need or want to, with or without me.

Through my journey of mobilizing prayer, worship, and evangelism in my region, I've found a few key approaches to be especially fruitful:

- Pray for God to open effective doors Trusting Him to lead rather than forcing opportunities.
- Follow where the Spirit is moving Resisting the urge to create something and ask for God's blessing after the fact, but instead seeking His movement first and joining in through prayer.
- Prioritize relational over transactional connections Humbly partnering with and supporting the mission God has given others, focusing on serving rather than gaining (or having them fulfill your mission).



learnings

- Under promise and over deliver, do everything with a spirit of excellence.
- We become like what we behold I've found it best to always encourage prayer gatherings to start with adoration and praise where God is magnified rather than spending all the time focused on "magnifying" the prayer requests.
- Networks are based on trusting relationships and one way to accelerate and multiply that is through **unified corporate prayer**.
- We've seen great fruit and tangible evidence of God's answers through strategic, specific, measurable prayers across the city of Columbus.
- Do your best to **discern where the Spirit is moving** and how the Father is working instead of planning something on your own and asking God to join it and bless it.
- Concerts of Prayer gatherings have really accelerated the unity and participation of churches across Columbus.
- If you're looking to draw in more leaders and churches, ask them to
 do something tangible such as pray at a gathering, host a worship
 night or prayer breakfast, write a devotional, speak as a featured
 ministry on a zoom call, post a prayer request etc.
- Leaders need a personal prayer team. Meet regularly with a group of committed intercessors who pray for one another. In person or over the phone each week is a great way to do it.
- Spirit-led, scripture-fed prayer is powerful and effective!

Kelton Moore grew up in Sidney, OH before attending Cedarville University where he pursued a double major in Christian Education and Youth Ministry. He went on to receive a Master of Divinity from Cedarville University, then moved to Springfield to serve as a jail chaplain in the Clark County Jail. In May 2023, he transferred to the Nehemiah Foundation where he now serves as their Community Chaplain.

He oversees the Clark County Prayer Canopy, which he helped launch in the fall of 2024. He also serves as the compliance



officer at SVdP, where he does data entry, documentation, and interprets for Spanish- and Haitian Creole-speaking clients. Having received deliverance from depression and suicidal ideation through Jesus in 2018, Kelton was certified to be a QPR suicide prevention instructor in August 2023 and wants to see others find holistic freedom from mental health struggles.

Kelton has a passion for seeing the Body of Christ united across denominational, ethnic, and social boundaries. He speaks Spanish and is learning Haitian Creole, which he uses on a regular basis to serve Hispanic and Haitian clients in his community. Jordon & Talon Baker In 2014, Jordon encountered Jesus in a life-changing way at the One Thing conference in Kansas City. At the time, I was caught up in addiction and the New Age movement. No one directly shared the Gospel with me—instead, during a moment in the prayer room, I heard the Gospel sung prophetically and had a powerful encounter with Jesus, much like Paul on the road to Damascus. In that moment, I gave my life to Him and was completely delivered. Since then, I've carried a burning passion to share Christ with others and to see them encounter Him in the same life-transforming way. On that same trip, Talon rededicated her life to Christ and has also seen the Lord move powerfully in the lives of those around her through her testimony of healing and freedom. Today, we live in our hometown of Mansfield with our three children, continuing to pursue Jesus and share His love wherever He leads.

In 2021, Jordon and Talon Baker received training in Disciple Making Movement (DMM) principles from leaders of the underground church—principles that have contributed to over 100 million new baptisms, primarily in the Global South. This training emphasized obedience-based discipleship, a vision for multiplication, gathering as the church in simple ways, and reliance on the Holy Spirit. A key part of their approach is Discovery Bible Studies (DBS), which empower individuals to engage with Scripture in group settings, apply the passage, and share it with others. They have seen dozens of DBS groups form locally, bringing the lost together to explore Scripture, encounter the love of Christ, and count the cost of following Him.

Building on this foundation, Jordon and Talon serve as disciple—makers with Global Catalytic Ministries (GCM), a DMM family active in 71 countries. GCM focuses on equipping indigenous leaders to make disciples, plant churches, and transform their communities—often in regions of significant persecution.

Locally, Jordon and Talon lead an emerging network of simple churches—organic, relational communities that love God, love others, and make disciples with Jesus as King. These simple churches meet in homes and everyday spaces, where believers grow in their faith, support one another, and actively reach the lost. Their vision is to see the Church emerge where people live, work, and play—building vibrant, multiplying communities that reflect the love and mission of Christ. They are committed to equipping ordinary people to live out the Gospel in everyday life and empowering them to become disciple–makers within their own circles of influence.

Since 2017, they have also been committed to fostering citywide unity in the Church by hosting various prayer initiatives with the support of 60+ local congregations. Their heart is to see the Body of Christ come together across denominational lines to seek God's presence and advance His Kingdom in their region.

Talon is also a visual artist with a passion for seeing the arts community encounter the life and hope found in Christ. Through her work, she seeks to create meaningful expressions of truth and beauty that point others to the Gospel. Her artwork is currently featured at a local gallery, where she uses creativity as a bridge to build relationships and spark conversations about faith.

Jordon serves on the global leadership team of 10 Days of Prayer (10Days.net), a movement dedicated to uniting believers worldwide for ten days of worship, prayer, fasting, and repentance. In 2024, over 500 gatherings were confirmed globally, reflecting the growing impact of the movement. The vision is to see thousands of cities engage simultaneously in this period of consecration,

forming a "global upper room." Jordon's role includes connecting city-wide prayer leaders with Disciple Making Movement (DMM) training, fostering a synergy between prayer and disciple-making by equipping prayer leaders with strategies to multiply disciples and establish simple churches.

Jordon and Talon are committed to advancing the Gospel by integrating prayer and disciple-making strategies, equipping believers to fulfill the Great Commission, and fostering unity within the Body of Christ.




